HARTLEBURY.

HARTLEBURY, a pleasant village, and extensive parish, distant two miles east from Stourport, five north-west of Droitwich, eleven north of Worcester, and three south of Kidderminster. Contained in 1841 (with the following hamlets of Mitton, Waresley, Torton, and Lincomb), 2,051 inhabitants. This parish is in the Union of Droitwich, and diocese of Worcester.

The CHURCH is a neat stone edifice, dedicated to St. James; was built in 1840. The tower contains six good bells. The living in the presentation of the Bishop of Worcester, who is lord of the manor, and resident at the Castle. Rev. Thos. Baker, M.A., is the present rector. Samuel Wiles, clerk. Service, 11 a.m., $3\frac{1}{2} \text{ p.m.}$

EYRE'S¹ CHARITY SCHOOL: founded by Mrs. Hannah Eyre of this parish, in 1728, who gave by will £200 to purchase land, or to be put out at interest, and the profit thereof to be disposed of by her nephew, Mr. Edwin Eyre and his heirs (if they can be conveniently consulted), the Rector, and Churchwardens, and their respective successors, to teach poor children to read and work. Sarah Evans, mistress. Average number of scholars, 16.
