STOURPORT

STOURPORT is a market town in the parish of Kidderminster, and Lower Halfshire Hundred; 124 miles W.N.W. of London, 12 miles N. of Worcester, and 4 S.W. of Kidderminster. The population in 1841 was 3,012. This town is very pleasantly situated on the rivers Severn and Stour, the former of which is crossed by a very handsome iron bridge of 150 feet span, The streets are wide and well paved, and are lighted with gas. A very considerable carrying trade is carried on here to all parts of the kingdom; the junction of the Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal and the river Severn affording great facilities for this trade. There also is an extensive iron foundry, for the manufacture of hollow ware, and the tannery of Mr. Joseph Rogers, which is considered the largest out of London. There is also a carpet manufactory and spinning mill; and vinegar works, belonging to Messrs. Swan and Co. The market days are Wednesday and Saturday, and fairs are held on the first Tuesday in April, July, and October.

The Church is a brick building, in the form of a cross, with a square tower. It has been enlarged, and will, at the present time, accommodate upwards of 1000 persons. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the gift of the Vicar of Kidderminster; the present incumbent is the Rev. R. S. Waller, M.A. Mr. John Jones, clerk. Mr. W Halmshaw, organist. Time of service, 11 a.m., 3¼ p.m.

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHAPEL: is a brick building, situated at the back of High Street. Circuit preachers. Service, 11 a.m., 6 p.m.

PRIMITIVE METHODIST CHAPEL: in Raven Street; is a small brick erection. Local preachers. Service, 2 p.m., 6 p.m.

The SAVINGS BANK is in Mart Lane, and is open for the transaction of business every Wednesday, from 12 to 1. Mr. Thomas Tyler, actuary.

The STAMP OFFICE is in High Street. Mr. Thomas Mark, sub-distributor.

The POLICE STATION is a neat erection: situate in York Street; it has three cells, which were built in 1850. Mr. John Bevan, superintendent

The BOYS' NATIONAL SCHOOL is situated in the Bewdley Road. Mr. Wm. Eaton, master.—The INFANT SCHOOL is in the same building. Susan Williams, mistress.

The GIRLS' NATIONAL SCHOOL is at Lower Mitton, and is a very neat building in the Elizabethan style. Miss Whatton, mistress.
