KIDDERMINSTER

KIDDERMINSTER, on the river Stour and the Staffordshire and Worcestershire canal, is a corporate, union, and market town, and parliamentary borough, and railway station situate near the north-west border of the county, in the Lower Halfshire hundred, Kidderminster division, diocese and archdeaconry of Worcester, and deanery of Kidderminster, West Worcestershire, 18 miles south-west of Birmingham, 82 north of Bristol, 15 north of Worcester, 3 north-east from Bewdley, 7 south-west from Stourbridge, 63 south-west of Derby, 50 from Stafford, 106 from Manchester, 44 from Gloucester, 37 from Cheltenham, 16 south of Wolverhampton, 4 north from Stourport, and 125 miles north-west of London. Kidderminster enjoys the advantages derivable from railroad communication to all parts of the kingdom, through the medium of the Oxford, Worcester and Wolverhampton line, which skirts the eastern side of the town, where is situated a suitable station. The parish, bounded on the west by the navigable river Severn, is divided into two unequal parts by the river Stour. The western division contains about 24 square miles, and the eastern 6 square miles. A great portion is hilly, but it is well cultivated. The town has been much improved of late years; several old and unsightly buildings have been removed, and in many instances modern houses and excellent shops have been substituted; the streets are numerous, lighted with gas, and kept in good condition. Kidderminster anciently claimed various privileges as a borough, and sent members to Parliament; by what means the privileges eventually censed cannot be ascertained; the Reform Bill, however, again made it a borough, sending one representative to Parliament. Alfred R. Bristow, Esq. is the present member. Kidderminster is celebrated for its manufacture of carpets, which trade began here in 1735. At first the Scotch or flat carpets, without a pile, were made; but in the year 1749 the cut carpets were introduced. Brussels and tapestry carpets are the principal part of the present manufacture, much of the Brussels being woven by steam power. Worsted spinning and dyeing are also carried on to a great extent, and there is a manufactory for damask silk goods for upholsterers' uses; and at Broadwaters are extensive tinplate works. There are iron, foundries, malting, breweries, paper mill, wireworks, brickfields, and tan yards.

The church of St. Mary is a spacious building, partly in the Decorated and partly in the Perpendicular styles. The tower is square, supported by massive buttresses, and ornamented with decorated battlements and pinnacles, and contains a peal of 8 bells. The walls are massive, with thirty-nine windows. The western window is of noble size, and is filled with beautiful stained glass, as are also the windows in the chancel. The inside of the building is very beautiful, and contains many ancient monuments. The living is a vicarage, annual value £1,107, with residence, in the gift of the Earl of Dudley, and held by the Rev. Thomas Legh Cloughton, M.A. The church of St. George is a handsome building, in the later English style, having a lofty and richly ornamented tower, with 2 bells. The outlay for building this church was paid by a grant from the Parliamentary Commissioners, at an expense of £16,131, to which was added £2,000 by voluntary subscription; it contains 2,000 sittings. The organ cost £600, raised by subscription. The altar was formerly adorned with the "Descent from the Cross," woven by the carpet loom by a manufacturer of the town; but this curious piece of workmanship was shamefully cut and defaced by some wanton person, who was never discovered, consequently it was removed, and the Creed and the Decalogue now occupy its place. The church, St. John the Baptist, built in 1843, in the Norman style of architecture, of a cross shape, is built of dark brick the mouldings of Bath stone; the cost, £4,000, was partly defrayed by a bequest of the late J. Woodward, Esq., partly by a grant from the Society for Building Churches, and partly by subscription. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the gift of the vicar, and held by the Rev. George Robinson Kewley. The chapel of the Holy Trinity, Trimpey, built in 1844, is in the Norman style, for 120 persons, and cost £800. In the year 1640, in the troublous times of King Charles I., the celebrated Richard Baxter was for several years minister here, and remained until the period of the Restoration. His pulpit is held in great veneration by the inhabitants and may be seen by visitors at the Unitarian chapel, Church street. The

living of St. George is a perpetual curacy, annual value £200, in the gift of the vicar; the Rev. Chas. John McQueen Mottram is the incumbent. There are places of worship in the town for Roman Catholics, Independents, Unitarians, Baptists, Wesleyans, and Primitive Methodists. The Town Hall is a large brick building, containing, besides other rooms for public purposes, the police station, to which prisoners' cells are attached; there is also a large union poorhouse and an infirmary; in the town are two respectable banking establishments, also a bank for savings. The schools are numerous and well conducted.

The market days are Thursday, for corn, fruit, poultry, meat, fish, &c.; and Saturday, for vegetables, &c. The fairs are held on the last Monday in January, the 13th of April, 28th of May, 20th of June, 4th of September, and the last Monday in November. The town is governed by a corporation appointed by the Municipal Act of 1835, and consists of six aldermen and eighteen councillors, who choose a mayor. Under the Act passed for establishing County Courts, in 1846, Kidderminster formed the twenty-fifth circuit; this court, for recovering debts and demands not exceeding £50, sits every three weeks at the Town Hall. The parish of Kidderminster consists of the borough of Kidderminster, the foreign of Kidderminster, and the hamlet of Lower Mitton, generally called Stourport, each having separate church and chapel wardens and overseers, and maintaining their own poor. For repairing the highways the foreign of Kidderminster is again divided into three hamlets, severally called the hamlet of Trimpey, Habberley, Franche, and Puxton; the hamlet of Wribbenhall, Netherton, Blackstone, Sutton, and the Lea; and the hamlet of Hurcott and Comberton. The population of the borough of Kidderminster amounted, by the census of 1851, to 17,035 independent of that part called the foreign, which was returned at 3,817 more.

The Baptist, Independent, Roman Catholic and Unitarian chapels, are licensed for the solemnization of marriages.

Kidderminster Public Rooms and Corn Exchange. This beautiful building is situate in Vicar-street, and erected on the garden ground belonging to the old vicarage. It forms a conspicuous feature in the large and noble buildings of Kidderminster. The architects were Messrs. Bidlake and Lovett, of Wolverhampton; the builder, Mr. John Thompson, of Kidderminster. The foundation stone was laid on the 7th of December, 1853, by Lord Ward, now Earl of Dudley. The Corn Exchange was opened on the 4th of January, 1855, by a public dinner, at which Lord Ward presided. The beautiful organ in the Music Hall, built by Hill and Co., of London, at a cost of £800, was opened by a grand festival and ball on the 16th and 17th of October, 1855, Clara Novello being one of the principal vocalists. The building comprises a spacious music hall 90 feet long by 45 feet wide, with a beautifully constructed orchestra capable of accommodating 100 vocal and instrumental performers. The body of the hall, with the gallery, will seat about 800 persons. It has side windows and also side gaslights, which, when lighted, have a very brilliant effect. The Corn Exchange is beautifully adapted for the purpose of a corn market, having a range of windowing along the roof of the room, as well as side windows. It is also well illuminated with gas lights; size, 60 feet long by 35 feet wide. The sittings of the County Court are also held in this room. A range of rooms of smaller dimensions occupy the front part of the building. One is used as a news-room, open from 9 a.m. till 9 p.m.; lessee, Mr. Thos. Mark, stationer, High-street. Another is occupied by the Corporation, and used for a free library, open from 10 a.m. till 9 p.m.; librarian, Mr. James Penny. Another is used as a school of design, and another as a chess-room; other rooms are also occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Penny as a residence, forming in the whole a beautifully compact and ornamental building, and deserving of the high praise bestowed upon it both by residents and strangers. Great praise is due to the proprietors of such a noble building for their liberality in taking up shares sufficient to complete such a work.
