Kidderminster, on the river Stour and the Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal, is a union and market town, municipal Worcestershire Canal, is a union and market town, municipal and parliamentary borough and railway station, situated near the north-west border of the county, in the Western division of the county, Lower Halfshire hundred, Kidderminster rural deanery, and archdeaconry and diocese of Worcester, 18 miles south-west from Birmingham, 82 north from Bristol, 15 north from Worcester, 3 north-east from Bewdley, 7 south-west from Stourbridge, 63 south-west from Derby, 50 from Stafford, 106 from Manchester, 44 from Gloucester, 37 from Cheltenham, 16 south from Wolverhampton, 4 north from Stourport, and 125 north-west from London. The poor law union comprises the following parishes:—Bewdley, Broom, Chaddesley Corbett, Churchill, Dowles (Salop), Kidderminster, Lower Mitton with Stourport, Ribbesford, Rushock, Stone, Upper Arley (Stafford), and Wolverley. Kidderminster enjoys the advantages of railroad communication with all parts of the kingdom, through the medium of the West Midland section of the Great Western Railway, which skirts the eastern side of the town, where is situated a suitable station. The parish, bounded on the west by the navigable river, Severn, is divided into two unequal parts by the river Stour; the western division contains about 24 square the navigable river, severn, is divided into two unequal parts by the river Stour; the western division contains about 24 square miles, and the eastern 6 square miles. A great portion is hilly, but is well cultivated. The town has been much improved of late years; several old and unsightly buildings have been removed; the streets are lighted with gas, and kept in good condition. Kidderminster anciently claimed various privileges as a borough, and sent members to Parliament; by what means the privileges eventually ceased cannot be ascertained; the Reform Bill, however again made it a borough sending one representative to

Kidderminster is celebrated for its manufacture of carpets, which trade began here in 1735. At first the Scotch, or flat, carpets without a pile were made; but in the year 1749 the cut carpets were introduced. Brussels and tapestry carpets are the principal part of the present manufacture, much of the Brussels being woven by steam power. Worsted spinning and dyeing are also carried on to a great extent; there is a manufactory for damask silk goods for upholsterers, and at Broadwaters are extensive tinplate works.

The Town is governed by a corporation elected under the Municipal Act of 1835, and consists of six aldermen and eighteen councillors, who choose a mayor. The County Court is held at the Corn Exchange monthly. The district comprises the following places:—The borough and foreign of Kidderminster, Arley, Areley Kings, Astley, Bewdley, Broom Chaddesley Corbett, Churchill, Dunley, Hartlebury, Lower Mitton, Upper Mitton, Ribbesford, Rushock, Stone, Stourport, and Wolverley. The parish of Kidderminster consists of the borough of Kidderminster, the foreign of Kidderminster, and the hamlet of Lower Mitton, generally called Stourport, each having separate church and chapel wardens and overseers, and maintaining their own poor. The church of St. George is a handsome building in the Later English style, having a lofty and richly ornamented tower with 2 bells; the outlay for building this church was

paid by a grant from the Parliamentary Commissioners, at an expense of £16,131 to which was added £2000 raised by voluntary subscription; it contains 2,000 sittings; the organ cost £600, raised by subscription. The living is a vicarage, annual value £300, in the gift of the vicar of St. Mary's, and held by the Rev. Charles John McQueen Mottram, M.A., of Magdalen Hall Oxford Hall, Oxford

The church of St. John the Baptist, erected in 1843, in the Norman style of architecture, of a cross shape, is of dark brick with Bath stone mouldings; the cost, £4,000, was partly defrayed by a bequest of the late J. Woodward, Esq., partly by a grant from the Society for Building Churches, and partly by subscription. The living is a vicarage, annual value £200, with residence, in the gift of the vicar of St. Mary's, and held by the Rev. Geo. Robinson Kewley, M.A., of University College, Durham.

The chapel of the Holy Trinity, Trimpley, built in 1844, in the Norman style, can accommodate 120 persons, and cost £800. In the year 1640, in the troublous times of King Charles I., the celebrated Richard Baxter was for several years minister here, and remained until the period of the Restoration: the house in High street in which, it is said, he resided is now the property of W. Hancocks, Esq.: his pulpit is held in great veneration by the inhabitants, and may be seen by visitors at the Unitarian chapel, Church street Church street

There are places of worship in the town for Roman Catholics, Independents, Unitarians, Baptists, Wesleyans, and Primitive Methodists.

The Town Hall is a large brick building, containing, besides other rooms for public purposes, the police station, to which prisoners' cells are attached. There is also a large union poorhouse and an infirmary. In the town are two respectable banking establishments, also a bank for savings and penny bank.

The Kidderminster Public Rooms and Corn Exchange, erected by a company, is situated in Vicar-street, and erected on the garden ground belonging to the old vicarage. The architects were Messrs. Bidlake and Lovett, of Wolverhampton; the builder, Mr. John Thompson, of Kidderminster. The foundation stone was laid on the 7th of December, 1853, by Lord Ward, now Earl of Dudley: the Corn Exchange was opened on the 4th of January, 1855, by a public dinner, at which that nobleman presided. The building comprises a spacious music hall, 90 feet long by 45 feet wide, with a beautifully constructed orchestra, capable of accommodating 100 vocal and instrumental performers; the body of the hall, with the gallery, will seat about 800 persons: it has side windows and also side gaslights, which, when lighted, have a very brilliant effect. The organ in the music hall was built by Hill and Co., of London, at a cost of £800, and was inaugurated by a grand festival and ball on the 16th and 17th of October, 1855. The Corn Exchange has a range of windows along the roof of the room as well as side windows; it is also lighted with gas; size, 60 feet long by 35 feet wide. The sittings of the county court are held in this room.
