The Book still continues in some measure to be a gazetteer, as a topographical account of every Town, Parish, Village and Township, and descriptions of the principal buildings and objects of interest, will be found in its pages.

## KIDDERMINSTER

KIDDERMINSTER, near the north-west border of the county, on the river Stour and the Staffordshire and Worcestershire canal, is a union and market town, head of a petty sessional division and county court district and a municipal borough, with a station on the West Midland section of the Great Western railway, 18 miles southwest from Birmingham, 82 from Bristol, 15 north from Worcester, 3 north-east from Bewdley, 7 south west from Stourbridge, 63 south-west from Derby, 50 from Stafford, 106 from Manchester, 44 from Gloucester, 37 from Cheltenham, 16 south from Wolverhampton, 4 north from Stourport and 125 north-west from London, in the Kidderminster division of the county, Lower Halfshire hundred and in the rural deanery of Kidderminster, archdeaconry of Dudley and diocese of Worcester. The Great Western line to Bewdley was opened in June, 1878. The parish, bounded on the west by the navigable river Severn, the western division containing about 24 and the eastern 6 square miles, is divided into two unequal parts by the river Stour. The town has been much improved and was thoroughly drained in 1872-3; is well supplied with water from works on the Stourport road, erected in 1872 and belonging to the Corporation, and lighted with gas from works in Pitts lane, being first thus lighted in 1819. Kidderminster anciently claimed various privileges as a borough, including the right of representation in Parliament, but this right, owing to the expense of supporting the members in London during the sitting of Parliament, was not exercised, and lapsed until partially revived by the Reform Act of 1832, which again made the town a borough, sending one representative to Parliament. Under the "Representation of the People Act, 1918," the borough was included in the division of the county to which it gives its name. A charter conferring various privileges was granted by King Charles I. in 1637, and the borough is now, since May 17, 1888, divided into six wards governed by a Corporation, elected under the Municipal Act of 1835, and consisting of six aldermen and eighteen councillors, who choose a mayor. The borough has a commission of the peace.

Kidderminster is celebrated for its manufacture of carpets, a branch of industry established here in 1735; at first the Scotch or flat carpets without a pile were made; but in the year 1749 the cut carpets were introduced: Brussels tapestry and royal Axminster carpeting form the larger portion of the present manufacture, much of the former being woven by steam power, but hand-loom weaving is still carried on to a limited extent, and, owing to the spirited action of the manufacturers and the energy of the Corporation, the local trade has of late years made considerable progress, and in the production of carpets the town may now claim to have obtained the foremost place. Worsted spinning and dyeing are also largely practised; at Stour Vale are the extensive works of Messrs. Baldwin's Limited, tin and terne plate and sheet iron makers. The cloth manufacture is known to have existed here as early as 1356.

The parish church of St. Mary and All Saints is a spacious building of stone, in the Early English, Decorated and Perpendicular styles, consisting of chancel with aisle and vestry, clerestoried nave, aisles and an embattled western tower, with pinnacles, containing a clock and 8 bells and 3 for chimes: the fine west window, as well as the windows of the chancel, are stained: all the clerestory windows have been filled with stained glass as a memorial to Dr. Claughton, Bishop of St. Albans 1877-90, and vicar here 1841-67: other memorial windows were placed in 1892 to William Chas. Awdry, d. Nov. 23rd, 1891. In 1872 the galleries were removed, an organ chamber built, and an organ erected, and a richly carved stone pulpit and massive font, both by Boulton, introduced, at a total cost

of nearly £3,000: later, in 1877, the church was re-seated and thoroughly repaired, and in 1880 the chancel was adorned with a fine reredos of alabaster, from a design by Mr. W. J. Hopkins, architect, of Worcester; the central division represents "The Last Supper," and on either side are figures of Moses and Elijah, under canopied niches: on the north side of the choir is an altar-tomb, with the effigy of a knight in armour, his head resting on his helmet, a ruff about his neck, and by his side a gauntlet, and a lion at his feet; on his left hand is an effigy of his wife, in the habit of a widow, with a book in her hands, and standing against the back of the arch are figures of five children and scrolls with initials; the tomb commemorates Thomas Blount esq. ob. 1569, and Margaret his wife, ob. 1595: at the south side of the choir, inclosing at the back a large shield of arms, is a full-sized semi-recumbent effigy in half armour of Sir Edward Blount, kt. 1630, and on an altar-tomb of alabaster, immediately in front, effigies of his two wives, Lady Margaret Neville and Margaret (Wigmore): on the north side, in a lofty arched recess, is a panelled altar-tomb with recumbent effigies to Walter de Cooksey esq. 1410, and Maud (St. Pierre), his wife: the moulding of the arch is enriched with ten figures standing on pedestals, and above is a panelled parapet, with arms and supporters: a panelled tomb of Perpendicular date, in the south aisle, with the effigy of a female, has been assigned to a Lady Beauchamp: there are brasses under a triple canopy, with shields of arms, to Sir John Philip and Walter Cooksey esq. and to Matilda, successively wife of each, 1415; both effigies have collars of SS.: a memorial cloister was erected in 1888 at the south-east angle of the chancel to the late Earl of Dudley, d. 7 May, 1885, at a cost of £500: extensive restorations were carried out in 1895 in the church at a cost of £7,000 by John Brinton esq. formerly M.P. for the borough, which consisted of a complete refacing of the stone work of the north and south clerestories, the west end of the nave, and the whole of the tower, also reinstating the stone groining under tower: in removing the blank window over the tower entrance the remains of the original window were discovered with deeply moulded tracery: in 1920 a stained glass window was added in the south-west porch and three stained glass windows in the south side, all to the memory of Bishop Claughton, a previous vicar of the church; and in 1921 a war memorial, designed by Gilbert Scott esq. was added to the north wall of the aisle: there are 900 sittings. The register dates from the year 1539. The living is a vicarage, gross yearly value £900, with residence, in the gift of the Earl of Dudley, and held since 1909 by the Rev. Lawrence Banks Sladen M.A. of Pembroke College, Oxford, surrogate, chaplain to the Kidderminster union, rural dean of Kidderminster, and hon. canon of Worcester. Richard Baxter, the distinguished Nonconformist preacher, was minister of this parish 1640-1661; his pulpit is now in the Unitarian chapel, but his chair remains in the church, and there is a portrait in the vestry, taken in 1691. St. George's and St. John's are ecclesiastical parishes, formed August 23, 1867, out of St. Mary's.

The church of St. George, erected at a cost of over £20,000, and consecrated September 13, 1824, is a building in the Gothic style, consisting of chancel and nave and a lofty and richly ornamented western tower, containing a clock and 2 bells: there are stained windows at the east end, a stone reredos and an organ, erected at a cost of £600, raised by subscription: a new choir vestry was erected in 1916, at a cost of £300 in memory of the Rev. T. W. Church M.A. vicar 1887-1915: the church affords 2,000 sittings, 1,700 of which are free. The register dates from the year 1824. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £508 with residence, in the gift of the vicar of Kidderminster, and held since 1918 by the

Rev. Robert Hume Stephen B.A. of Brasenose College, Oxford. The Mission church of St. Andrew, in this parish, erected in 1890 at the cost of about £1,000 by the Rev. Clement Ernest Newcomb B.A. is an iron building, consisting of chancel, nave, transepts and organ chamber: an organ was built in 1892 at a cost of £230, raised by subscription: the church affords sittings for 450 persons.

The church of St. John the Baptist, erected in 1843 at a cost of £4,000, and considerably enlarged and altered during the period 1890-94 from the designs of Mr. J. A. Chatwin F.R.I.B.A. at a cost of £15,000, is an edifice of blue brick with Bath stone dressings, now chiefly to the Early English style, consisting of apsidal chancel, with vestries on the north, nave, aisles, and on the south side the apsidal chancel, nave and south aisle with transept of the previous church, now forming an annexe, with south porch and a western tower with pinnacles and a lofty broach spire, containing a dock and 2 bells: in 1884 a memorial window was placed in the north, transept to the late Joseph Kiteley J.P. but it has since been removed to the south clerestory, and there is another to the Rev. William Allen, sometime curate here: in 1912 the east window of the chancel was filled with stained glass in memory of the late John Andrew Humphreys J.P.: the altar table of carved oak was presented as a memorial to Mrs. E. J. Morton: there are two stained glass windows at the south end of the church and a stone memorial in the churchyard to the memory of those who fell in the war: there are sittings for 1,100 persons, 700 being free. The register dates from the year 1843. The living is a vicarage, net yearly Value £420, with residence, in the gift of the vicar of Kidderminster, and held since 1917 by the Rev. Roger Harry Bertie Roberts M.A. of Christ Church, Oxford. In 1885 a portion of this ecclesiastical parish, was annexed to Lower Mitton. The Mission church of the Holy Innocents, at Foley park, in this parish, erected in 1889 at a cost of £400 and since enlarged, is an iron building consisting of nave and north aisle, and will seat 250 persons.

St. Barnabas church, FRANCHE, consecrated in 1871, as a chapel of ease to All Saints, is an edifice of brick with stone facings, in the Gothic style, erected in memory of the Rev. H. J. Fortescue M.A. hon. canon of Worcester, at a cost of £3,000, borne by his daughters, and occupies a site given by the late J. Chellingworth esq.; it consists of chancel, nave, vestry, south porch and a small tower with spire, containing one bell: there are 170 sittings: services are conducted by the clergy of St. Mary and All Saints.

The Mission church of St. James, erected in 1872, at a cost of about £2,000, wholly given by the Rev. H. J. Fortescue M.A. in connection with the church of St. Mary and All Saints, and situated near the Horse Fair, is a plain edifice of red brick, consisting of chancel, nave, vestry, class-room, western porch and a bell turret on the north side containing one bell: there are 250 sittings, all being free: services are conducted by the clergy of St. Mary and All Saints.

The chapel of the Holy Trinity, Trimpley (a chapel of ease to All Saints), erected in 1844, at a cost of £800, is a building in the Norman style, consisting of chancel, nave and vestry: it will seat 120 persons. The Rev. Frederick Cleaton Hughes has been curate in charge since 1917.

The Catholic church, dedicated to St. Ambrose, is a structure of brick in the Early English and Decorated styles, consisting of chancel, nave, aisles and a lady chapel: a spire and peal of bells were added in 1911: there are five memorial windows, two of which were erected by Mrs. Shepherd to her husband: there are 400 sittings. The Baxter Congregational chapel, adjoining the Town bridge in the Bull Ring, occupies the site originally purchased in 1660 for the erection of a church in which to carry on the work begun by Richard Baxter, and on which two structures were successively built in 1754 and 1824 (the old meeting house), the latter being removed in 1884 in order to erect the present building, which is of red Alveley stone, in the Early Decorated style, from designs by Mr. F. D. Tarring, architect, of New Southgate, and was built at a cost of £8,998, raised by subscription: there is a tower and spire with pinnacles at the south-west angle, 140 feet in height, and a memorial window to the late Mrs. Banks, erected by her husband: there are 980 sittings.

The Baptist chapel, built in 1808, will seat 600 persons: the Baptist chapel (Milton hall), Lorne street, erected in 1890 at a cost of £2,200, will seat 350 persons: the Wesleyan Methodist chapel, built in 1803, seats 600; and there is another in

Birmingham road, erected in 1905 at a cost of £6,000, seating 500: the Primitive Methodist chapel, built in 1902 at a cost of £2,500 (exclusive of site), has 500 sittings: there is a chapel for the Countess of Huntingdon's Connexion, first founded in 1774; the present structure was built in 1820, and has sittings for 500 persons. Christadelphian services are held in the Co-operative Hall, Worcester street, which holds about 150 persons.

The Unitarian chapel, in Church street, originally built in 1782, was re-opened in 1883, after alteration and enlargement, under the superintendence of Messrs. Payne and Talbot, architects, of Birmingham, at a total cost of £2,600, and will now seat 700 persons: the new front elevation is of a local reddish-brown stone, with Bath stone dressings, to the Perpendicular style: the pulpit formerly used by Richard Baxter, a fine specimen of oak carving and dated 1621, is preserved in the vestry.

The Swedenborgian chapel, in Comberton hill, was erected in 1908.

A Congregational hall was opened Oct. 9, 1907.

The Cemetery, adjoining the old cemetery of about three acres, covers an area of sixteen acres, and was opened June 1st, 1878: it contains two mortuary chapels, one erected in 1840 and the other in 1878: there are houses for the superintendent and one man. The Burial Committee) consisting of nine members, takes the place of the Board, formed in 1875.

Kidderminster and District School of Science and Art, erected on a site given by D. W. Goodwin esq. J.P. at the angle of Exchange street and Market street, and opened October 1st, 1879, is an edifice of Stourbridge fire brick and Grinshill and red Alveley stone, in the Early Renaissance style, from plans by J. M. Gething, architect, and contains a large elementary art room, 62 feet by 40 feet; antique, metal work, modelling and embroidery rooms, painters' and decorators' shop, cabinet making and carpentry room with benches for 18 students, head master's room, caretaker's rooms &c. The Science department includes two chemical laboratories, a physical laboratory, a dye laboratory and class room, a lecture room for 140 students, a smaller lecture room and several class rooms, and there is a museum, 52 by 41 feet, with a picture gallery all round it. There are altogether about 500 students in the schools.

The Town Hall, which adjoins the Corn Exchange, was erected by a company and transferred to the Corporation in 1874; it is situated in Vicar street and stands on the garden belonging to the old vicarage house. The foundation stone was laid on the 7th December, 1853, by the 1st Earl of Dudley, and the Corn Exchange was opened on the 4th of January, 1853. The building comprises a spacious concert hall, 85 feet long by 45 feet wide, with an orchestra, capable of holding 100 performers, and has an organ, erected at a cost of £800; the body of the hall, with the gallery, will seat about 800 persons. The Corn Exchange is 60 feet long by 35 feet wide. Rooms of smaller dimensions occupy the front part of the building, and are used for committee purposes.

The meetings of the Chamber of Commerce are held at Municipal Buildings.

The Municipal Buildings, erected in 1876, at a cost of more than £8,000, on a site adjoining the Town Hall, in Vicar street, is a building of Hollington stone and brick in the Renaissance style, from designs by Mr. J. T. Meredith, architect, of Kidderminster: it has a frontage of 69 feet to Vicar street and contains on the ground floor a large entrance lobby, main staircase and public staircase for witnesses, and the usual municipal offices and the rooms occupied by the borough police; on the first floor are the council Chamber and police court, fitted with handsome oak and pine furniture, and attached to these are committee and consulting rooms; on the same floor are the town clerk's offices and the mayor's parlour. The police cells are in the rear.

The Corporation plate includes a loving cup of solid silver, presented 27 July, 1894, by the Earl of Dudley.

The Workmen's Club and Institute, founded to 1856 and situated in Church street, possesses billiard, recreation, chess, reading and smoking rooms, and a library of about 2,000 volumes; There were to 1920 400 members.

The Free Public Library is in Market street. The Free Libraries Acts were adopted in this town in the year 1854, but no lending library was established until 1881, when a room in the Municipal buildings was used for the purpose; but in 1892-4

a permanent building was erected, at a cost of £4,000 (exclusive of site), and contains a reading room, 53 by 40 feet; the lending library, with the librarian's office, contains 6,480 books, and the annual issue is about 50,000; the reference library contains 2,801 volumes, the annual issue being about 27,000; the basement contains file and binding rooms, and over the lending library is a lecture room, 45 by 36 feet; several handsome gifts have been presented by the late Sir A. F. Godson (d. 1906), a former M.P. for the borough and by M. Tomkinson esq. of Franche Hall; William F. Baillie, librarian.

The Post Office and Telephone Exchange, in Exchange street, erected in 1884, at a cost of £2,700, is a handsome building of red brick with Bath stone dressings, relieved in front by fluted pilasters, with moulded panels intervening.

There are three banks in the town.

The market days are Thursday, for corn, fruit, poultry, meat and fish; and Saturday, for meat and vegetables. A cattle fair is held every alternate Tuesday in the market, which was opened in 1871, in the New road. The whole of the old fairs have been abolished with the exception of a pleasure fair held the third Thursday in the month of June.

There are carpet factories, worsted spinning and dyeing mills, maltings and breweries.

The Kidderminster Infirmary and Children's Hospital, built in 1870, at the upper end of Mill street, but first established in 1821, is a structure of red brick in the Gothic style, and contains male and female wards, with 76 beds. In 1886 the fever wing was transformed into a children's hospital, the cost being defrayed by the late Sir Thomas Lea bart. M.P., J.P.; this has two wards, containing seven and six beds respectively; there are also nurses' rooms, bath rooms, laboratory &c. An isolation ward was erected in 1888, from plans by Mr. J. T. Meredith, architect. The Victoria Memorial operating theatre and the "William Adam" ward, containing six beds, were added in 1903; the latter was the gift of Mrs. Adam, his widow; an X-ray room, was added in 1910, and there is also a dispensary for out-door relief.

The Borough Infectious Diseases Hospital, built in 1884, has cost with subsequent additions £5,000, and will hold 60 patients.

A drinking fountain, the gift of the late John Brinton esq. formerly M.P. for the borough, from designs by Mr. J. T. Meredith, architect, was erected in 1876 on the open space at Worcester Cross, somewhat near the railway station; it contains several basins and dog troughs, arranged round a central shaft, which is carried up as a clock tower and finished with a dwarf spire, the whole rising to a height of 40 feet.

In 1883 a drinking fountain and cattle trough of Alveley stone was erected at Blakebrook, from the designs of Mr. J. M. Gething, architect, the site and cost being defrayed by D. W. Goodwin esq.

Opposite the Town Hall is a marble statue by Mr. Thomas Brock B.A. of London, and a native of Worcester, erected in 1881, at a cost of about £1,700, collected in about four years, in small sums, chiefly penny postage stamps, from all parts of the world, to perpetuate the memory of Sir Rowland Hill K.C.B., D.C.L., F.R.S. who was born here Dec. 3, 1795, and suggested and ultimately carried out the penny postage system

which came into operation Jan. 10, 1840, and for which he received a national testimonial.

Brinton Park, now consisting of 44 acres of tastefully laid out ground, was presented to the town August 1, 1887, by the late John Brinton esq. D.L., J.P. of Moor Hall, Stourport, and formerly M.P. for the borough, and an addition of 20 acres was made by the Corporation in 1906. It is close to Sutton Common and Stourport road, and commands extensive views of the surrounding country.

In 1640, the celebrated Richard Baxter, born 12 Nov 1615, at Rowton, in Shropshire, became by invitation the minister of this town, but on the breaking out of the Civil War he undertook the duties of chaplain in the Parliamentary army, and was present at several sieges; he afterwards returned here and had the courage to oppose the usurpation of Cromwell, and in the very presence of the Protector to defend the monarchy. He remained at Kidderminster until the period of the Restoration, when he was made one of the king's chaplains and assisted at the Savoy conference; he subsequently removed to London, where, on account of some passage in his paraphrase of the New Testament, he was imprisoned, but released on the mediation of Lord Powis. He died 8 Dec. 1691, and was buried in Christ church, Newgate street, London; the house in High street in which it is said he resided is now the property of the representatives of the late W. Hancocks esq. and his pulpit may be seen by visitors at the Unitarian chapel, Church street: in 1875 a white marble statue was erected to his memory in the Bull ring, at a cost of about £1,200; the figure, modelled by T. Brock esq. of London, is about 8 feet high, and stands upon a substantial pedestal of Aberdeen granite.

The land in Kidderminster is held by a number of small owners.

Under the provisions of the "Local Government Act, 1894," Kidderminster Borough civil parish was, in 1894, extended to include that part of Kidderminster Foreign civil parish in the municipal borough.

The area of Kidderminster Borough civil parish, which comprises the municipal borough, is 1,990 acres of land and 23 of water; rateable value, Lady Day, 1920, £109,648.

The population of the municipal wards in 1911 was:—St. Mary, 3,541; Baxter, 4,557; St. George, 4,518; Rowland Hill, 3,694; Park, 4,188; St. John, 3,835; total, 24,333

The population of the ecclesiastical parishes in 1911 was:—St. Mary's, 9,361; St. John the Baptist, 9,517; St. George's, 8,851.

The area of the parliamentary borough is 2,266 acres; the population in 1911 was 26,062. The number of electors on the parliamentary register in 1920 was 10,791.

Parish Clerks.—(All Saints'), John Dovey; (St. George), Harry Beech; (St. John the Baptist), John Whatley.

KIDDERMINSTER FOREIGN is a civil parish not included in the municipal borough. Major John Henry Crane J.P. is a landowner in the parish of Kidderminster Foreign and lord of the manor of Habberley. The area is 7,099 acres of land and 68 of water; rateable value, £13,290; the population in 1911 was 3,393, including 19 officers and their families and 332 inmates in the Poor Law Institution.

Franche and Trimpey are hamlets in this parish.
